A place with more than a thousand years of history, the town of Livigno first appeared in a document in 1187, and its history began then—or perhaps much earlier. The leading figures have always been the 'livignasc'ch' who, day after day, have worked hard with the ambition to transform a small community into one of the most popular lifestyle destinations, both in winter and in summer, becoming **the venue for the Milan Cortina 2026 Winter Olympics**. This vital dream come true confirms the destination as one of the best winter resorts for freestyle and snowboarding in the world.

The high-level tourist offering proposed by Livigno is characterized by three pillars: 'Powerful' which tells of Livigno's adrenaline - and energy-rich soul; 'Chic' which highlights the resort's more lifestyle aspect; and 'Moving' which emphasizes Livigno's dynamism in every context and for every sporting activity, combining sport and wellness, two ways of taking care of body, mind, and spirit. These are complemented by the locality's values: respect and care for our land, which is rich in unspoiled nature; care for people, citizens, and tourists; pride in traditions, which are celebrated and handed down to keep the uniqueness of the area.

These pivotal points are reflected in each of the activities available in the area: from adrenaline-pumping experiences in contact with nature, surrounded by the most famous Alpine peaks, to more relaxing activities that regenerate mind and body, and lifestyle offerings, such as exclusive shopping and the discovery of traditional and gourmet flavors. Livigno's offerings highlight the many facets of the destination, which are deeply intertwined. It combines relaxation, entertainment, good food, sport, and nature every season.

Therefore, Livigno is an Alpine pearl that dominates the valley from its altitude and captivating energy; it is an authentic place to pursue one's passions, whatever they may be, and to experience unique and unforgettable.

LIVIGNO GREEN

The municipality of Livigno makes a concrete, daily commitment to offering its community and tourists a **green lifestyle**. The resort performs many **eco-sustainable actions** daily to preserve the environment, territory, and landscape. Among the most critical initiatives with a sustainable approach, Livigno encourages the use of **public transport** both within the town and to reach the destination.

Italian tourists can reach Livigno by train by purchasing the **Io Viaggio Ovunque ticket in Lombardy** at a promotional price. This ticket allows them to get to the Tirano station and then take a bus to Livigno. Swiss tourists can use the **Graubünden Pass** to reach Zernez by train and then continue by bus or train to their destination.

In partnership with the Lombardy Region, Sondrio's Agenzia del Trasporto Pubblico and the Municipality of Livigno, Italy and Switzerland created the Interreg Omni-BUS 4.0 project to promote the implementation of a modern, integrated, and sustainable public Alpine cross-border transportation system. Within the cross-border cooperation project, Interreg V Italia-Svizzera Omni-BUS 4.0 touches on crucial issues in the relationships between the two Countries: mobility and accessibility, which are essential for citizens, workers, and for the many tourists that move between the Sondrio Province and the Canton of Grisons. Expanding the public transportation network and promoting the interconnections between different operators - railway lines, bus lines, shipping companies, and cableway installation providers - the project aims to increase the number and quality of transportation services offered to local

users and tourists. It also promotes local enhancement and accessibility, favoring lowenvironmental-impact transfers.

On the local level, however, Livigno has made the public transport service between the different areas of the village completely free of charge - with four bus lines in the winter season and two in the summer season. There is also a year-round connection service between Livigno and Trepalle. This is a concrete commitment to encourage the use of public transport by both Livigno residents and international tourists.

Thanks to a partnership with Repower, Livigno has provided charging stations for simultaneous and fast vehicle charging for those who own electric vehicles or e-bikes. The charging stations are strategically placed across the territory so drivers and bikers can recharge and continue their journey anywhere in the town.

Another green measure is **conscious waste management**. Livigno has implemented a project to create about **60 Molok®** areas between Livigno and Trepalle. This is a safe and clean solution for disposing of waste sustainably and efficiently. Additionally, the large capacity of the bins reduces the need for traffic vehicles for waste collection, consequently decreasing environmental pollution.



With over 100 km of skiable surface area, Livigno is an ideal mountain destination for those seeking a dynamic lifestyle aimed at excellent performance—whether alone, with others, or alongside ski coaches, mountain guides, and ski instructors.

The Alpine destination offers **115** km of slopes at an altitude of almost 3,000 meters, providing unparalleled comfort for athletes, enthusiasts, and beginners. The slopes start from the town center, next to hotels and flats. Furthermore, thanks to the resort's altitude, fresh snow is guaranteed throughout the **long winter** (from early December to early May).

On the two sunny sides of the valley, there are **74 slopes with different difficulty levels** making them suitable for everyone. These are connected by **six gondola lifts** (Carosello 3000 I and II, Mottolino, Livigno Centro Tagliede I and II, Cassana), **14 chairlifts**, **and 11 platter lifts**. The Skilink service has been active since 2018 and is also included. With free shuttles, skiers can move continuously from the Carosello side to the Mottolino side in a few minutes.

SKI AND SNOWBOARD CTORS

Livigno can boast more than **150 instructors**, including former professional athletes and national instructors of various disciplines, all **trained by the Italian Ski School**, one of the best in ski instruction.

Thanks to their multifaceted professional sports training, the instructors are well-prepared to meet any need in **all snow sports**, such as alpine skiing, snowboarding, telemark, cross-country skiing, freestyle, and freeride. With their **knowledge of many foreign languages**-including English, German, Polish, Russian, and more-the instructors offer the best snow experience to international tourists who have chosen Livigno for their winter holidays.

Livigno's ski and snowboard instructors are also the stars of the 'Instructors' Show' every Tuesday at 9 p.m. They entertain visitors with performances related to the sports world, including the parallel giant slalom competition, freestyle acrobatics with skis and snowboards, exciting ski choreography with vintage clothing and equipment, a torchlight procession, and a raffle with ski lessons up for grabs.

The instructors are organized into **10 local schools**, all strategically located at the start of the slopes: the Livigno Sport Academy (Via Domenion 182), the New Ski and Snowboard School (via Ostaria 257), the Italian Ski School Azzurra (via Ostaria 81), the Italian Ski School Livigno Galli Fedele (via Saroch, 634), the Italian Ski School Livigno Italy (via Fontana, 210), the Italian Ski School Livigno Ski Planet (via Saroch, 810) and

the Central Ski and Snowboard School (via Plan, 273), and also the Livigno 2000 Cross-country Ski School (via Isola 113), the Giorgio Rocca Ski Academy (via Fontana, 90) and the Madness Snowboard School (via Bondi 473/B).

State-of-the-art schools also offer customized services for people with disabilities. In fact, the instructors are qualified to teach people with disabilities of all ages using specific equipment. For example, the B.A.S.S. (Borney Adapted Snowboard System) allows assisted snowboarding or monoskiing for people with lower limb disabilities and intercom guidance for blind people.



SNOWPARK | SNOWBOARD | FREESTYLE

Year after year, Livigno has become the ideal destination for snowboarding and freestyle enthusiasts who can try their hand at adrenaline-fueled jumps and exciting tricks in the resort's numerous snowparks. Enthusiasts of these disciplines can choose between the Mottolino Snowpark, The Beach - Snowpark Carosello 3000, the Amerikan Snowpark—which is perfect for beginners trying out their first jumps on 15 available structures—and the Snowpark20, which is over 200 meters long, created and managed by the team behind the Funny Twenty Arealt features around 20 structures for all kinds of fun.

Due to the historical presence of these large snowparks, Livigno was chosen as the ideal Italian host city for the snowboard and freestyle competitions at the 2026 Milan-Cortina Olympics.

With an area of 800 meters in length, four lines of jumps suitable for all abilities, and over 60 obstacles of varying difficulties and sizes, the Mottolino Snowpark is recognized as one of the best snowparks in Italy and among the most renowned in Europe. It offers an adrenaline-pumping experience for beginners and experts alike. The world's best professional riders in freestyle and snowboarding have always chosen to train in this Snowpark for the most important competitions of their careers –even Olympic ones–because it offers a wide range of cutting-edge facilities.

In its more than twenty years of history, this Snowpark, located in the Mottolino ski

area, has hosted **events of international significance**-such as the Burton European Open, Audi Nines, Burn River Jump, and World Rookie Fest-thanks to its innovative and modern construction.

The Beach-Snowpark at Carosello 3000, featuring a stunning tropical setting and a Surfer's House at an altitude of 3,000 meters, is an easy Snowpark. Thanks to the various facilities in the area, freeskiers and snowboarders can learn and improve their skills in performing jumps and stunts.

However, many Mini Snowparks on both sides of the valley are suitable for beginners in the freestyle world. Among these are the **Amerikan Snowpark**, ideal for those wanting to experiment and tackle their first jumps on skis or snowboard, and the **Snowpark20**, which is more than 200 meters long with over 20 structures, including small and large jumps, boxes, and rails of all types.



FUN PARK

Livigno offers many Fun Areas where amateurs, professionals, and experts can test themselves with new types of runs.

Two areas are located on the Carosello 3000 side: the **Flying Km**, a very steep slope with flat parts that ensure an adrenaline-pumping run, and the Beach-Fun slope, the most extended fun area in the world. It has a course of over 1,700km, an unexpected summery design, and 22 steep curves, 8 bumps, and 2 spirals.

On the Mottolino side, there is the **Natural Pipe**, a completely natural half-pipe for sequential jumps and tricks; the **Natural Moguls**, where natural bumps are formed during snowfall; and the Self Timing area, with race poles and a time trial for challenging friends and family to set new personal records.

When the evening comes and the slopes empty out, the brand-new Snowkarts go into action at Skiarea 29. In their winter version, these tricycles allow skiers to have fun on the slopes every Tuesday and Wednesday from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. For tobogganing enthusiasts, there is an illuminated toboggan run every Monday from 4 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. at the San Rocco lift.

Lift no. 23 is open every Thursday evening for night skiing from 8.30 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.



FRERIDE AND HELISKI


Livigno provides high-quality and long-lasting soft snow thanks to its geographical position and altitude. For this reason, its **100 km** backcountry attracts lovers of adrenaline-pumping, authentically alpine, and 'limitless' experiences, such as **freeriding** and **heliskiing**. The Heliski experience involves ascending pristine mountains by helicopter, where freeriders-previously trained on safety measures and accompanied by a UIAGM Mountain Guide-can experience the thrill of off-piste skiing.

The Valtellina resort is among the mountain destinations that have believed most in freeriding. For this reason, the municipality of Livigno has decided to activate and strengthen the services dedicated to off-piste skiing with the Freeride Project. Unique in Italy and operating for several seasons, the Freeride Project is based on the **Avalanche Bulletin**, a daily information service prepared every morning by the Livigno Avalanche Service. As a member of the European Avalanche Warning Services Association (EAWS), the Livigno Avalanche Centre provides all the essential information on snowpack stability across different areas of Livigno.

Additionally, the **Snow Quality Bulletin** is available daily, showcasing snow conditions, skiing quality, and rock exposure across the three primary skiable areas: alpine, woodland, and below the tree line.

Before the official communications are sent out, the information is analyzed and integrated with data from the Bormio Arpa and the Swiss Avalanche Centre SLF. Updates are spread through a daily newsletter, the official website, the Livigno Weather Instagram page (full of valuable content), local billboards, videos at ski lift stations, totems around town, and the MyLivigno app.

Additionally, the Freeride Center team and Alpine Guides are on hand to provide follow-up meetings and valuable tips.



HIGH ALTITUDE EXPERIENCES

In addition to traditional slopes, Livigno offers exciting high-altitude experiences for winter sports enthusiasts looking to enjoy the snow in unique ways.

Powder Day: After a significant snowfall, the **Carosello 3000** gondola opens earlier than usual at 7:30 a.m., at no extra cost beyond the regular ski pass, to access specially ungroomed slopes. This allows freeriders to enjoy fresh powder early in the morning. Guests can then visit the Freedom Eagle at the top of the gondola, where hot tea will be served to celebrate the occasion.

Sitas Ski Area offers four unique experiences at different times of the daysunrise, sunset, and night-tailored to different interests: Sunrise Emotion & Luxury Breakfast: Every Tuesday from 7:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., guests can enjoy skiing on freshly groomed slopes at sunrise, followed by a delicious international breakfast at high altitude.

Sunset Emotion: Organized daily at 6:30 p.m., this experience includes a ride on a snowcat to enjoy the slopes at sunset and take in the breathtaking views of Livigno as night falls.

Top Emotion: For food enthusiasts, this experience offers a gourmet dinner exclusively based on fish at Rifugio Costaccia, reachable via snowcat at 7:00 p.m., surrounded by the region's typical alpine ambiance.

When the sun sets and the slopes empty out, the brand-new Snowkarts come into play at Skiarea 29. These winter tricycles offer a fun experience, allowing skiers to

ride down the slopes every Tuesday and Wednesday from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. For those who love tobogganing, an illuminated toboggan track is available at the San Rocco lift every Monday from 4:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

WINTER PROMOTIONS

During the winter season, Livigno offers a variety of promotions suitable for all types of visitors, allowing you to fully enjoy the resort's winter wonderland and thrilling slopes.

Skipass Free is an annual promotion that lets you enjoy a **free ski pass with an extended stay in Livigno**. The offer applies to stays starting from 4 nights in affiliated hotels, up to 7 nights, or a maximum of 14 days in affiliated apartments. To benefit from this offer, bookings must be made directly through the accommodation facility or via the resort's official website.

This year, the promotion is valid from 30 November 2024 to 20 December 2024 and from 12 April to 01 May 2025. However, during the Easter period (from 18 April to 21 April), the promotion is available only for minimum stays of 7 nights, both in apartments and hotels.





Livigno's winter season is synonymous with dynamism and excitement, thanks to the wide array of outdoor sporting activities. Surrounded by majestic alpine landscapes and caressed by crisp, energizing mountain air, the resort is a haven for those seeking adventure in the snow.



CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING

Livigno is a prime destination for cross-country skiing enthusiasts. Nordic skiing can be practiced as early as the last week of October, thanks to a **technical loop** that opens, made possible by the innovative snow farming technique introduced in 2016. This technique preserves snow throughout the summer months using sawdust and geothermal sheets, preventing melting during the warmer months. A **30km cross-country track**, starting from the Forcola and Alpe Vago areas, provides the perfect setting for sports teams, professional athletes, and enthusiasts to enjoy natural snow-even out of season-at high altitudes. Additionally, the **Marianna Longa trail** is a **5km technical loop** with several elevation changes, ideal for a perfect workout.

You can access free locker rooms at the Cross-Country Skiing Stadium or book a lesson with qualified instructors.

Cross-country skiing is a true passion for Livigno, and every year, the resort hosts several competitions for both professionals and amateurs. La **Sgambeda** attracts hundreds of participants to compete at the Cross-Country Stadium, while La **MiniSgambeda** offers young skiers the chance to showcase their talents in the same arena.

SCI ALPINISMO, CIASPOLE E I PERCORSI GESTITI

Livigno offers 150 km of pristine land, with many trails waiting to be explored by **ski** mountaineering or snowshoeing.

Ski mountaineering is a fascinating sport for mountain lovers, practiced off-piste in unspoiled settings. It allows adventurers to explore the most authentic parts of the territory using specialized equipment such as skis, ski mountaineering boots, poles, and skins, to reach higher altitudes and remote areas.

Thanks to the resort's altitude, the more experienced adventurers can enjoy ski touring as early as mid-November, when the first snowfall typically occurs. Several routes suitable for all ability levels can be found in the area. Still, it is always advisable to arrange for an Alpine Guide to be with you, who will help you at the checkpoints to verify the proper functioning of the avalanche transceiver.

Snowshoeing is a great way to experience the beauty of Livigno's landscapes. It allows you to explore the woods, trails, and un-groomed tracks, offering a chance to connect with nature.

There are snowshoe trails stretching from the lake area to Forcola Pass, varying in difficulty to accommodate every level of fitness. Guided tours can be arranged through the Cross-Country Ski School or Alpine Guides, with weekly excursions for groups of 6 to 10 people.



For enhanced safety, Livigno has developed 'patrolled trails,' which are carefully managed by the Freeride Project team.

These trails, located near the lifts, are regularly groomed after each snowfall and are clearly signposted for various activities. There are **five ski mountaineering trails** (marked with blue and orange poles) **and seven snowshoe trails** (marked with green and fuchsia poles).

Maps for these trails are available for free on Livigno's website, and the daily Avalanche Bulletin and Snow Quality Bulletin provide vital information on snow conditions, stability, and exposure in the resort's three skiable areas.





ALTITUDE TRAINING

Livigno's unique location in the Rhaetian Alps, with elevations ranging from 1,816 to 3,300 meters above sea level, makes it the perfect destination for **altitude training**. Athletes flock to Livigno for performance enhancement, as training at high altitudes improves oxygen transport mechanisms in the body, boosting endurance and aerobic capacity.

This is why many professional athletes choose Livigno for their training camps, especially those involved in endurance sports. National teams, including those from Italy, Spain, Japan, Norway, Sweden, and more, regularly select Livigno for their pre-competition preparation, particularly in the spring when the snow is still abundant.

Livigno is not only a great place for training but also offers top-notch facilities to support athletes. The Aquagranda fitness and wellness center is an Olympic Preparation Centre, officially recognized by the Italian National Olympic Committee (CONI). This multi-sport facility provides high-quality equipment and services to athletes preparing for various sports, making Livigno a key destination for elite training.



FAT BIKES

Fat Bikes are an innovation of the last decade. They have unique technical features, including an enlarged cross-section and low tire pressure, ensuring maximum grip even on soft surfaces like snow.

These maxi-wheel bikes, suitable for people of all ages, are also available in an electric version – the **E-fat bikes** – for those who prefer a low-impact sporting activity to enjoy a ride on any route and incline. Mini-fat bikes for children and 'Chariot,' a baby carriage designed and built on skis for carrying children from 0 to 6 years old, are also available.

Fat bikes, in all their versions, are ideal for venturing along the green-marked patrolled trails, which are entirely dedicated to walking and fat biking, or for discovering the cycle lane, a 20-km-long track perfect for all seasons and suitable for all ages that winds along the village. Customized tours with local mountain bike guides are also available on request.

BIATHLON

Biathlon is an Olympic discipline that combines two sports-cross-country skiing and rifle shooting-and belongs to the Nordic skiing discipline. Its name derives from the Greek and means 'double challenge.'


The Biathlon Arena has opened in Livigno. It is an area equipped with 12 electronic shooting stations, open all year round, and carefully designed to offer, at any time, an ideal environment for biathlon enthusiasts, both professional athletes seeking the best sporting performance and amateurs or beginners wishing to approach the sport.

Like all other Livigno sports facilities, the arena's location at an altitude of over 1,800 meters guarantees greater endurance and, thus, excellent training performance.

For neophytes or beginners, private laser biathlon lessons are available. These lessons are organized by qualified instructors who will share tips and techniques for learning or improving one's skills.

WINTER TRAIL

The 20-km groomed snow trail starts in Livigno's heart and winds through the valley. The trail is perfect for running, horseback riding, and Nordic Walking, a walking technique with sticks that helps increase walking speed, strengthen arms and shoulders, improve back posture, and tone buttocks and abs. Those who wish can book a guided tour by contacting the Cross-Country Ski School directly. The school organizes weekly excursions for groups of 6 to 10 people.



OTHER WINTER ACTIVITIES

In Livigno, the valley of the Olympians and sportspeople, there are plenty of activities for keeping fit or for those who appreciate a dynamic lifestyle. The fil rouge is snow, the true star of Livigno's winter season.

The area offers different solutions for **ice climbing**, a sporting activity that shows the mountains in their wildest winter guise. For this reason, it requires the accompaniment of an Alpine Guide and specific technical equipment.

Paragliding is the best option for those who want to experience the high-altitude spirit of Livigno. It is an unforgettable experience to enjoy a unique view of the Livigno Valley to be admired from above after jumping into the sky by Livigno Feel the Sky.

Animal lovers will also find endless winter opportunities in Livigno. Horseback riding enthusiasts can embark on exciting excursions across the snowy landscape. Whether you're an expert or a beginner, professional instructors ensure a safe and enjoyable ride through the scenic mountain paths. For those seeking something original, a walk with Ilamas and alpacas is a delightful experience. These friendly animals accompany you on a 30-minute hike through Livigno's picturesque mountain paths, offering a fun and unforgettable adventure.

Another alpine experience is the **horse-drawn sleigh ride**. A charming way to experience Livigno's winter beauty is on a horse-drawn sleigh ride. Whether shared with family, friends, or a partner, this relaxing ride through the snow-covered landscape allows you to slow down, breathe in the fresh winter air, and immerse yourself in nature.

Livigno also offers thrilling activities for those who enjoy a little extra excitement.

The Ice Arena features a large rink that occasionally hosts hockey matches. Perfect for family or group outings, **ice skating** in this picturesque setting is a fun winter activity for everyone.

For motor enthusiasts, **Ice Driving** offers an adrenaline rush. Navigate a special car on an icy track, with the Ice Driving School providing safe and competitive driving tests. Speed lovers can rent **quads**, **ice-karts**, **and snowmobiles** at various rental points, including the lake and Passo d'Eira. These vehicles allow you to explore Livigno's winter wonderland with speed and excitement.





ROAD TO MILANO-CORTINA

Livigno has always been the home of sportspeople and is preparing to leave its mark on the 2026 Milan-Cortina Winter Olympics by hosting Freestyle and Snowboarding competitions. This makes Livigno the heart of the Freestyle snow sports world, proudly known as 'The Valley of the Olympians.'

The Olympic Games will feature 26 competitions in Livigno, marking the culmination of years of hard work, commitment to athletes, and dedication to delivering an exceptional spectator experience. Livigno's unique landscape and world-class facilities are key reasons for its selection, as well as its sustainable approach to preserving its natural surroundings.

VISION AND GOALS

Each site for the Milan Cortina 2026 Olympics was identified and chosen by several principles, which were also taken in Lausanne and led to the Milan Cortina 2026 victory.

Besides the sustainability values and the optimal use of existing iconic sites, consideration was also given to the experience that athletes will have at the different sites, to the opportunities for spectators, and the legacy that the Games can bring to the territories - following the development plans of cities and regions - and finally to the renovated facilities and improved accessibility for future generations.

Another factor contributing to the nomination as an Olympic site is that Livigno has been following the path to **sustainability** for several years, becoming greener and greener in many ways to preserve its fantastic natural setting.

The landscape, the amount and quality of services offered, infrastructure, sports activities, and attention to detail made Livigno a top destination for sportsmen and women. This result was also achieved thanks to the Aquagranda Olympic Preparation Centre, a leading facility for altitude training in Italy, which makes Livigno a prime destination for athletes aiming for Olympic success.




THE FACILITIES: MOTTOLINO AND CAROSELLO 3000, TWO ICONIC SITES

Both Livigno sides will be involved in the Milan Cortina 2026 Olympic Games.

Mottolino Fun Mountain will be the stage for half-pipe, slopestyle, big air, snowboard cross, ski cross, and parallel giant slalom competitions. The ski area is a benchmark for freestyle and is preparing to welcome the Olympic challenges with renovated facilities in terms of speed and comfort. This winter, the new Mottolino gondola and Monte Sponda chairlift, with heated seats and state-of-the-art technology, are offering visitors an experience anticipating 2026.

Carosello 3000, on the other hand, will be the place where the world's best athletes will compete in the disciplines of moguls, dual moguls and aerials. From 11 to 13 March 2025, the Carosello slope will host the finals World Cup finals of moguls, dual moguls and aerials, the first test event in view of the Olympics.



INFRASTRUCTURES

Livigno has consistently been recognized as a **highly advanced** resort with services designed for sportsmen and women. When nominated as an Olympic site, the Municipality immediately took the first steps toward the Olympics by improving several of the town's infrastructures.

Aquagranda, Livigno's fitness and wellness center, was recently named an Olympic Preparation Centre by the Italian National Olympic Committee (CONI). The center has earned full accreditation, meeting all the necessary standards required by sports federations. Its journey began in 2014 when the Italian national swimming team, led by Federica Pellegrini, chose it as their training facility. Since then, it has become a high-level multi-sport hub, hosting national teams for altitude training each year, further cementing its status as a key destination for athletes worldwide.

In anticipation of the 2026 Milan-Cortina Olympics, Livigno is implementing several legacy measures to enhance both the event experience and the resort's long-term sports and tourism offerings. One key decision was to avoid building an Olympic Village in order to respect the local environment. Instead, existing hotels will be renovated to accommodate athletes and coaches, ensuring minimal disruption to the natural landscape.

The Società Infrastrutture Milano Cortinais is overseeing the planning and implementation of Olympic and Paralympic works for the 2026 Games, including the renovation of Livigno's venue.





Construction began in the summer of 2024 for a **500-car underground parking** facility in the Marangona area. This will blend into the landscape, provide more green space, and reduce traffic by 23%.

Several works are also underway on the Carosello slopes, which will host the Moguls and Aerials tracks, with completion expected by the end of 2024. In the Mottolino area, four international competition slopes are being built, featuring halfpipe, parallel giant slalom, snowboard cross, and slopestyle, alongside a storage basin and pumping station. This infrastructure will ensure energy efficiency and sustainability for both the Olympic and post-Olympic events.

LIVIGNO'S ATHLETES

Livigno has fostered strong connections with world-class athletes, some of whom are native to the area. These athletes have trained on Livigno's slopes and trails, bringing home medals from national and international competitions.

The Livigno Team consists of local and international athletes specializing in various disciplines, including freestyle, snowboard cross, alpine skiing, cross-country skiing, biathlon, triathlon, and mountain biking. Some notable members include: Flora Tabanelli, Miro Tabanelli and Marta Silvestri (Freestyle), Jole Galli (Ski Cross), Maurizio Bormolini (Alpine Snowboard), Niccolò Colturi and Michela Moioli (Snowboard Cross), Simon Talacci (Alpine Skiing), Nicola Galli (Snowboarding), Gioele Bertolini and Mattia Longa (Mountain Bike), Elia Viviani (Road Bike), Michele Bormolini (Car), Veronica Silvestri and Teo Galli (Cross-country Skiing), Paolo Rodigari (Biathlon), Giacomo Bormolini (Telemark), Giulio Molinari (Triathlon), Edoardo Mottini and Giulia Murada (Ski Mountaineering). For these athletes, the mountains, trails, and slopes of Livigno, along with the facilities at Aquagranda, are integral to their preparation, helping them achieve peak performance.

Livigno also attracts top athletes from around the world. Some well-known figures who train here include: Sebastian Kienle, multiple Ironman world champion, the Italian national athletics team, cyclists Alberto Bettiol, Elia Viviani, Elena Cecchini, Sonny Colbrelli, Wout Van Aert, Mathieu Van Der Poel, and the entire UAE Team Emirates team captained by star Tadej Pogacar.

Winter sports champions chose Livigno for their training, among them the Italian National Alpine Ski Team with Sofia Goggia, Federica Brignone, and Marta Bassino, Lara Gut with the Swiss National Alpine Ski Team, Mikaela Shiffrin, Ester Ledecka, the Norwegian National Cross-Country Skiing and Biathlon Team with Johannes Klaebo, the British National Freestyle and Snowboard Team, Federico Pellegrino, and Greta Laurent with the Italian National Cross-Country Ski Team, and many others.

Livigno has also been home to many **former athletes** who have forged lasting bonds with the resort. These athletes continue to promote and cherish their connection to Livigno, including: Federica Pellegrini, Livigno's number-one ambassador around the world, Italian cross-country skiers such as Marianna Longa, Simone Urbani, and Morris Galli, and alpine skiing professionals such as Giorgio Rocca, Luca Moretti, Daniela Zini, Lorenzo Galli, Iwan Bormolini, Maddalena Silvestri, and Daniel Giacomelli.

Livigno is also the birthplace of top athletes, Some of these homegrown champions include: snowboarding champions Rudy Galli, Vanessa Cusini, Hanzel Longa, Mauro Longa, and Matteo Bormolini, and freestyle skiing and freestyle moguls Yuri Silvestri, Damiano Bormolini, Giorgio Zini, Rudy Mottini, Mattia Pegorari, Simone Mottini, Walter Bormolini, Mariangela Parravicini, Luca Ferioli and rugby player Rudy Biancotti. Among the athletes who proved their skills on the ice are Katja

Colturi and Olympic medalists Katia Zini and Mara Zini. Further Italian biathletes who have made history in this discipline in Italy are Livigno's Rudy Zini and Olympic medalists Dorothea Wierer and Lisa Vittozzi.

The resort's dedicated **fun parks** ensure that kids have a blast on the slopes, too. The **Yepi Area in Mottolino** features a mini park where children can try freestyle structures like music tunnels, punch balls, and small waves of artificial snow along the "Yepi Way."

As we know, children's creativity and curiosity have no limits. In Livigno, a place is created to stimulate these qualities and allow people to experience new emotions: the **Kinder Park Lupigno**. Located near the Centrale Ski School, this park features merry-go-rounds, trampolines, inflatables, and a variety of snow activities. Children can learn about this natural heritage during a **guided tour of Alpe Livigno**. From the excitement of milking cows to a visit to a local dairy, they'll rediscover the pure essence of mountain life.

At **Agriturismo La Tresenda**, families can enjoy a **walk with Ilamas and alpacas**, experiencing a deep connection with animals and nature. Meeting these friendly creatures and walking through the beautiful mountain paths offers an unforgettable experience for children of all ages.

For more fun on the snow, head to Livigno's **Ice Arena**. Here, families can glide gracefully across the ice, enjoying a day of fun and competition surrounded by the breathtaking scenery of snow-capped peaks.





In the lively streets of Livigno's center, life unfolds at a relaxed yet chic pace. The resort's restaurants, bars, and boutiques perfectly capture its Alpine spirit, blending mountain charm with the pleasures of shopping and nightlife.

FOOD AND WINE: A BLEND OF TRADITION AND INNOVATION

Livigno's food and wine scene offers a wide variety of options, from the vibrant streets of the town center to the cozy mountain huts and cabins in the surrounding valley. The cornerstone of the region's cuisine is high-quality, genuine raw materials, often

sourced locally. The culinary offerings are rooted in Livigno's history and traditions but are reinterpreted by chefs to convey the essence of the area. Several initiatives showcase these food and wine traditions:

1.The Livigno Chefs and Pastry Chefs Association - Associazione Cuochi e Pasticceri di Livigno (ACPL): Founded in 2001, this association works to preserve and promote Livigno's culinary heritage. The association hosts events like **Sentiero Gourmet**, a **5-kilometer "taste marathon"** in the Vago Valley, where visitors can experience local flavors at different stages.



- **2.The Tas'T-Livigno Native Food** Project involves organizing gastronomic corners in local hotels featuring 100% locally made and Tas'T-labelled products, such as bresaola, dairy products, bread, and desserts. All items are made with carefully selected Italian raw materials to ensure high-quality, natural food.
- **3.Leina da Saor:** A bilingual photo book published by Mondadori and created by the Livigno Chefs and Pastry Chefs Association. Leina da Saor offers recipes passed down through generations. The book includes ancient recipes recovered by the community, allowing visitors to experience Livigno's culinary traditions firsthand. This culinary journey results in a book containing 100 traditional recipes, 37 reinterpreted dishes, and more than 250 stunning photographs. This allows visitors to recreate Livigno's authentic flavors even after they return home, bringing a piece of the region's culinary tradition with them.
- **4.**The Associazione Mattias was founded in memory of Mattias Peri, the first chef from Livigno and Valtellina to receive a Michelin Star in 2009. Mattias gave Alpine cuisine a distinctive identity, becoming one of its most beloved interpreters. His influence remains strong, especially for young chefs who strive to follow in his footsteps. Thanks to him, Livigno experienced a significant leap in culinary quality. Each year, the Associazione Mattias organizes fundraising events to support scholarships for the most deserving students at Hotel and Catering High Schools in Lombardia and Trentino Alto Adige, recognizing aspiring chefs for their excellence in the culinary arts.

SHOPPING

Livigno's pedestrian center is an open-air mall at an altitude of 1,816 meters. With 250 shops, exclusive boutiques, and flagship stores, it offers a blend of traditional and modern shopping experiences.

From Made in Italy products to international brands, and from artisan workshops to high-tech shops, Livigno is a paradise for shopaholics.





NIGHTLIFE IN LIVIGNO

After a day on the slopes or exploring the village, visitors can unwind in Livigno's vibrant bars and après-ski venues. Whether relaxing with friends over a Bombardino, a hot drink, or a cold beer, this is the perfect way to end the day.

One popular story is that of the Bombardino, a hot drink created in Livigno in the 1970s by a young man from Genoa who wanted to combat the mountain's freezing temperatures. Made with milk, whiskey, and eggnog, the first person to taste it is said to have exclaimed, "Damn! It's a bombard!"-thus naming the drink.

As evening falls, DJ sets at places like **Stalet** and **Central** après-ski fill the air with music from around the world. At **David's** après-ski, guests enjoy typical Alpine dishes in a cozy setting. For live music, head to **Tagliede**, a historic venue at the base of the Livigno-Centro gondola.

Night owls will also enjoy Livigno's Disco Pubs, such as Marcos Pub, famous for its rock music nights and over 80 live events during the winter season. Bivio Club, located in the town center, combines Livigno's traditional spirit with a modern and glamorous atmosphere. Miki's Pub is popular with young people, offering après-ski fun and dancing late into the night. At Helvetia's Pub, après-ski turns into lively theme parties with disco music, games, and karaoke.



Livigno is one of the most internationally recognized Alpine destinations, celebrated for its traditions and its journey to becoming what it is today. The resort embraces its past, allowing visitors to step back in time and experience its unique Alpine spirit.

A WALK THROUGH HISTORY: PAST AND PRESENT

To understand Livigno's history, one must travel back to 1187, the year the village was first mentioned in a historical document. The name Livigno is likely derived from the late Latin word labineus, meaning "place subject to avalanches." Several centuries later, in 1799, the district of Trepalle was officially included within Livigno's territory, Trepalle holds the distinction of being Europe's highest inhabited district, situated

between 1,900 and 2,200 meters in altitude. Despite the harsh climate and its remote location, the locals managed to survive thanks to their great spirit of adaptation.

The economy was primarily based on livestock farming, dairy processing, and meadow care, as the freezing temperatures allowed only limited agricultural production, mainly consisting of **turnips**. This hardy, vitamin-rich root could withstand the cold mountain temperatures. For many years, life in Livigno remained unchanged until **1952 when the Foscagno Pass opened**, followed by the **Munt la Schera Tunnel in the late 1960s**. These developments marked the beginning of the village's transformation from a quiet farming community into a lively tourist destination.

THE MUS! MUSEUM OF LIVIGNO AND TREPALLE

Stepping into the MUS! Museum feels like walking into an old Livigno dwelling, immediately immersing you in the town's past. The museum has faithfully recreated domestic environments from Livigno's history, along with thematic sections featuring ethnographic objects carefully preserved over the years.

This journey through time allows visitors to appreciate the culture, traditions, and daily life of the region, from food to education. The history of Livigno resounds throughout the museum's walls, where every piece tells a story. Visitors can either explore the museum independently with **informative labels** and an **audio guide** or book a **guided tour** for a deeper dive into the region's past.

FATHER PARENTI AND HIS MISSION IN TREPALLE: theorigins of Guareschi's Don Camillo in Europe's highest village

Connected to Livigno by a scenic road and a panoramic trail through the Val Tort, the Trepalle district lies at an altitude of 2,069 meters, making it Europe's highest residential area. Its history is inextricably linked to that of Father Alessandro Parenti, an energetic and innovative parish priest who made a lasting impact on the village and Valtellina's history.

Father Parenti arrived in Livigno in 1929, soon after his ordination. At the time, the village lacked electricity, telephones, and running water-during winter, the snow had to be thawed for drinking water. Temperatures often dipped below 30 degrees Celsius. Despite these challenging conditions, Father Parenti quickly set to work, focusing on educating and guiding the community through Holy Masses, preaching, confessions, catechesis, and using rectory rooms as a kindergarten and elementary school. He also

provided support for the sick and less fortunate families, going well beyond traditional pastoral duties.

Father Parenti took advantage of Livigno's extra-customs status, founding a cooperative and a company to run the village's petrol station.

Thanks to his determination and connections, he gradually brought about substantial changes to the village. In 1936, he installed electricity in the rectory and other buildings using a water turbine, eventually achieving year-round electricity in 1948 through an internal combustion engine. He also brought a telephone line to the village in 1948, secured the opening of the Foscagno road in winter in 1951, and managed to establish an aqueduct in 1958.



In September 1970, after 41 years of service, Father Parenti passed on his mission to Father Adriano Ponti, a valuable collaborator. He passed away on October 17, 1980, leaving behind countless fond memories.

Father Parenti's influence extended beyond the village, inspiring the writer Giovannino Guareschi, who visited Trepalle in the summer of 1948. During his visit, Guareschi met Father Parenti and was so impressed by him that the character of Don Camillo, from his famous stories, is believed to have been inspired by this meeting. The village of Trepalle is an ideal destination for those seeking to live away from the city and be surrounded by nature. In the first story of Gente così, published in the weekly magazine Candido on October 10, 1948, Giovannino Guareschi mentioned a village named Trebilie, which appears to be a literary counterpart to Trepalle. The sparkling energy of Father Alessandro Parenti, with his generosity and sensitivity, inspired Guareschi in creating the character of Don Camillo, whose adventures were featured in the book Mondo Piccolo, particularly in the story cycle Storie dell'esilio e del ritorno.





When Christmas comes to Livigno, the village transforms into a magical winter wonderland. The joyful holiday spirit fills the air, turning the entire resort into a miniature Christmas village. Markets, festive decorations, and illuminated trees create a fairy-tale atmosphere, with snowflakes as the starring feature, much like the most beautiful winter postcard.

THE CHRISTMAS VILLAGE

From November 29 to January 6, the heart of Livigno is dressed in vibrant lights and colors, with the cozy wooden huts of the Christmas market lining the snow-covered streets. The town center will be filled with the typical scents and flavors of the season:

roasted chestnuts, local sweets, hot chocolate, and mulled wine. Background music sets the mood as both adults and children explore the offerings of Livigno's artisans.

CHRISTMAS SHOPPING

As you wander through Livigno's town center, the festive lights and decorations highlight the Alpine charm of over 250 shops. Exclusive boutiques, perfumeries, hitech stores, jewelers, and small shops selling local products catch the eyes of curious visitors. Background music fills the air, and each person searches for the perfect gifts for family, friends, and loved ones while discovering an endless array of delightful surprises.

NEW YEAR'S EVE

As the old year draws to a close and hearts are full of excitement and hope, both locals and visitors are eager to create unforgettable memories on the final day of the year in Livigno.

In the late afternoon, ski instructors prepare for the traditional **torchlight** parade, a thrilling event that snakes its way down the slopes towards the village.

At the end of the torchlight procession, the ski instructors will ignite a wooden sign, symbolically bidding farewell to the old year and welcoming the new one. The procession, led by torchbearers, creates a magical atmosphere, and anyone who has registered is invited to join. The parade culminates in front of the large wooden "2024" sign, which is then set on fire as part of a symbolic farewell to the past year and a warm welcome to the new one. The evening continues with toasts of mulled wine and a colorful fireworks display lighting up the sky.

GHIBINET

In Livigno, the Christmas holiday extends until Epiphany. On this day, the children of Livigno and Trepalle ride their sleighs through the town center, going door to door while joyfully shouting the traditional exclamation "Bondì Ghibinet!" as they hope for gifts and sweets in return. This ancient greeting is used throughout the Valtellina on Epiphany Day, likely originating from the German term "Gaben-Nacht," meaning "night of gifts." It recalls the Gospel episode in which the Three Wise Men arrive in Nazareth with their gifts.





When entering Aquagranda, two things immediately come to mind: its magnitude and its avant-garde design. At 10,000 square meters, it is one of Europe's largest sports and wellness centers. But that's just the beginning. Within the center, visitors can find everything they need, from cutting-edge fitness and sports equipment to areas dedicated to fun, leisure, and relaxation for both adults and children.

As a mark of its excellence, Aquagranda was named an **Olympic Preparation Centre** in October 2022. Officially recognized by the Italian National Olympic Committee (CONI), the center meets the highest quality standards required by sports federations.

Athletes and national teams from various disciplines come here to supplement their training and improve their aerobic capabilities.



FITNESS&POOL

The **Fitness&Pool** area is the ideal spot for those wishing to engage in **both gym and swimming activities**.

The 350-square-meter fitness area is equipped with the latest generation **Technogym equipment**, as well as the new **MagneticDays bikes**. These bikes can be used independently or with the support of qualified **Personal Trainers**, who design customized training plans to meet any need throughout the year.

Aquagranda is also home to **KINEO technology**, featuring machines designed for **personalized training**, making it perfect for **physical rehabilitation**. The aim is to focus on functional training, with services like single- or double-stance functional tests, and specialized training programs including viscous, isometric, isotonic, and isokinetic methods. These are ideal for pre- or post-surgery physical therapy.

Moreover, more than 20 fitness and water classes are available, including Total Body, Spinning, ABT, Pilates, and Aquarelax to help promote both body and mind well-being. Special classes, such as Aquafunctional, Tabata, and Cross-Functional, are also offered.

For a complete fitness experience, the center boasts a **50-meter Olympic-size pool**, which has hosted the Italian national swimming team and numerous European federations. In fact, the legendary Federica Pellegrini previously trained here, making Aquagranda the home of her Academy.

WELLNESS&RELAX


Aquagranda is also the perfect place to unwind and rejuvenate. When it's time to take a break and focus on relaxation and well-being, the **WellnesS&Relax** area offers a sanctuary for restoration.

This zone is designed to cater to every need, featuring several relaxing spaces: a swimming pool with hydromassage beds and seats, a salt-water pool, a Turkish bath, a bio sauna, a Finnish sauna (90°C) for Aufguss rituals, a cooling area with ice and cold well, a Kneipp path, 3 relaxation areas.

The new outdoor area enhances the wellness experience with a beautiful garden, offering a new course of whirlpools, saunas, and experience showers. This allows visitors to enjoy Alpine Wellness while surrounded by nature. The outdoor section includes: 4 whirlpools with 35-degree water, 1 reaction bath with 15-degree water, 1 whirlpool with 35-degree water, 1 relaxation area with brazier, 2 areas dedicated to experience showers and, last but not least, An Alpine Event Sauna, one of the largest Finnish saunas in Europe, which accommodates up to 100 people. This sauna is the heart of the daily Aufguss rituals and Aufguss Show.

These wellness rituals involve a gradual rise in temperature and offer extraordinary benefits for athletes, such as muscle relaxation, lymphatic system stimulation, immune system strengthening, and toxin elimination.

Alpine Wellness doesn't stop here. The center features treatment **cabins** offering various types of massage for complete regeneration. Guests can also include in facial and body treatments. Every Wednesday, Aquagranda hosts **Aperi-Wellness** at the **Wellness Bar**, providing a relaxed atmosphere where guests can enjoy light drinks, appetizers, and live music performances.



SLIDE&FUN

The **Slide&Fun** area is designed to entertain the entire family, from infants to adults. It includes: a Baby Pool for children aged 0-3, with water games and a 20cm water depth. The **Magic Castle**, a vibrant structure for children aged 3-14, featuring slides, waterfalls, and a giant water bomb.

Two adrenaline-pumping water slides: Bazooka and Active Blue, along with an innertube water slide, Crazy River, suitable for children over 120cm and adults.


For families who want to unwind together, the **Family Sauna and Turkish Bath (Family Hammam)** offer a relaxing experience while teaching children the benefits of wellness.

The center also includes an **Outdoor Panoramic Pool** located in the garden next to the Slide & Fun area. This pool is perfect for families, as children can play while parents enjoy a peaceful moment, all while surrounded by Livigno's stunning natural landscape.

A babysitting service is available daily (except Saturdays) from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. for children aged 4-14, with a €5 surcharge. This service allows children to have fun in the Slide & Fun area under supervision, giving parents the opportunity to relax in the Wellness & Relax area.

For family entertainment, a daily entertainment service is offered (except Saturdays) from 2 p.m. to 8 p.m. A skilled entertainer organizes activities and games for all ages, from children to adults.





RUN&PLAY

Located outdoors and surrounded by breathtaking Alpine scenery, the **Run&Play** area features a **6-lane athletics track**, perfect for athletes training at high altitudes. The track is sheltered from the wind by a plant-covered wall.

Additionally, the area includes a **regulation football pitch** made of both real and synthetic grass, which is popular among football teams for their training camps. Necessary equipment for various athletic disciplines is also provided. In addition to the athletics track, Aquagranda also provides equipment for various athletic disciplines, including hurdles running, javelin throwing, shot putting, and the 3000-meter steeplechase. There is also a **beach volleyball** and **beach tennis** court.

Aquagranda manages all the **tennis courts** in the area, with plans for new courts to be constructed in the center soon. Visitors can book courts for private use or arrange one-to-one or group lessons with FIT-qualified instructors.



BAR&BISTROT

After a day of relaxation and fun, the Bar&Bistrot area offers a great place to enjoy delicious dishes.

Located next to the Slide&Fun area, it features large windows that provide a view of the activities. Guests can order **healthy and balanced meals made with local products**. The menu includes salads, first courses, and main dishes. Notably, the Felicetti pasta, Livigno's official sponsor, is a standout item. The **quality** of the food makes it ideal for both sports enthusiasts and those with more refined tastes.



Livigno's strong connection to the region is a point of pride for the locals. To celebrate this bond, Livigno has created a special clothing line and a board game that allows visitors to bring a piece of Livigno home after their winter holidays.

LIVIGNO-BRANDED BOARD GAME

This fun game is designed for both kids and adults. Players can choose from various tokens, such as a groundhog or skier, and embark on a journey through Livigno.


6 FEBRUARY | CIRCLES, IL VIAGGIO DEI GIOCHI

The main races will be divided between ski cross and slalom, offering different modes of challenge. The ski cross will see the athletes compete in an obstacle course with curves, jumps and fast sections, where in addition to technique it is essential to have quick reflexes and physical endurance. Slalom, on the other hand, will test the skiers' precision and speed, with close gates requiring pinpoint control of turns.

25-27 APRIL | SNOWLAND

A unique musical event in Italy - a concert at high altitude, surrounded by nature and snow and wrapped in Alpine energy.
